Easter is just about as late as it can be this year. Do you know how Easter is calculated? Easter is on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the equinox. Whew! It sure would be easier if Easter were always on the same Sunday... like Mother's Day... we know that's going to be on the 2nd Sunday in May. It would be easier... but I like that we keep the ancient tradition for Easter. I think it's cool that even those who have absolutely nothing to do with the church celebrate this day along with us. They must have a ton of questions about Easter... and especially why it isn't on the same Sunday every year. Well, now you know, and you can pass it along. They must wonder about Peeps and chocolate bunnies and eggs, all the surface stuff. I can tell you about them... ask me sometime!

As Christian people who follow the liturgical calendar, we have a unique perspective on the seasons and really the movement of the earth. We begin April in the middle of the season of Lent. Spring has sprung! The daffodils in the gardens at church are beautiful (thanks, Mary Lou); the rhodies are blooming... the birds are coming around a little bit more. The word "lent" means "spring". As we meditate and remember who we are, as we commit to a more disciplined life during the Lenten season, spring explodes around us. 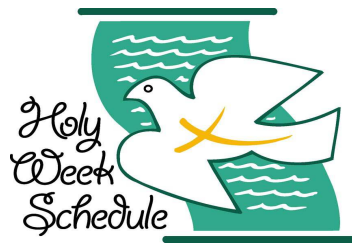

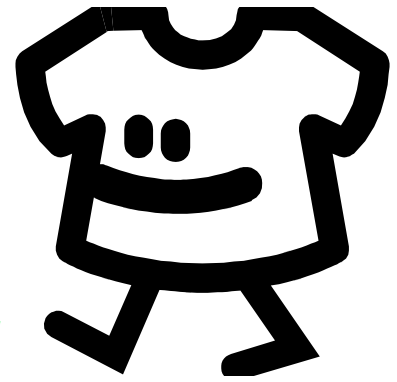

2011 – Creator’s Year of Hospitality

April—Advocacy

For the first three months of Creator’s “Year of Hospitality” our focus was on general activities where we all participated with a more or less similar commitment. We all can learn children’s names, wear name tags and invite friends to Mardi Gras with little disagreement.

This month's focus "Advocacy" moves hospitality to a different level. Through our faith many of us feel called to speak out in favor of those other than ourselves, to add our voice to make a difference in the direction or the priorities of today's world. The visions and methods of doing this are personal and there is a greater possibility for disagreement with one another on what can or should be changed and the urgency of effecting that change.

Given how personal advocacy is we will not present a general congregational activity for the month. Instead this can be a month to focus on involvement and what motivates or causes you to hesitate or makes feel you can't help.

To give examples of current advocacy, we have among our members those who encourage Creator to add their voice to those who are expanding Adolescent/Young Adult Oncology programs. Others belong to Citizen Groups, advocate for youth, collect food for the King’s Cupboard, and encourage us to make a difference. There are also members who have advocated for groups that have been historically excluded from church life. This month we will have the chance to learn about life in Palestine, fair trade olive oil and what it supports on April 10 during the Adult Sunday School class as Faye Bennett (Tini Maier’s mother) shares her experiences in Palestine with the class. We will also have an opportunity to write letters advocate for the hungry through Bread for the World.

Recently I heard someone quote James 4:14 “... What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes.” He used this verse to support his understanding that Jesus would not be concerned about making life better in our fleeting world but, rather, came to satisfy the justice of God and save the lost from eternal damnation. He admitted that “Yes, Jesus cared for and fed people once but he didn’t feed them every day. In fact, he refused to create that kind of welfare state.”

Another perspective comes from Father Barry’s sermon on the docks in the film “On The Waterfront” where he preaches, “Some people think the Crucifixion only took place on Calvary. They better wise up!” The film’s main character struggles with the choices he is being forced to make. He initially tells the woman he is attracted to that he can’t help her in speaking out for her brother who was killed. He asks if she is sore at him for not being able to help. She responds with a heartfelt “You would if you could.”

Her response radiates with possibilities. Is she speaking from a conviction that he has made his best attempt to help her, is she naively assuming there is nothing he can do to help, or is it her faith that challenges his beliefs of the moment and moves him to ultimately provide the help she is seeking?

Our understanding of what the proper relationship of church, politics and economics is in life will likely differ and change within each one of us. Christianity, however, is about love in action. We do not need to be concerned if our congregation is in lock step with one another on what actions to take but we can know and honor that those actions, together with our deepest convictions, are expressions of God’s work.

From the Treasurer

First Quarter Update

We're through the first quarter of the year now, so it's a good time to report on how we are doing financially.

The income chart shows that we were about \$1,700 under budget for giving in January, \$200 under budget in February, and an alarming \$4,500 under budget for March. For the quarter, we are a total of \$6,400 under budgeted giving.

The expense chart shows that we kept expenses \$700 under budget for January, \$200 under budget for February, and \$600 over budget for March. For the quarter, we are a total of \$300 under budget for expenses.

The results of this are shown in the net profit chart. Net profit is simply income minus expenses. While we had a budgeted loss of \$7,500 (remember that we got caught up on the 2010 benevolence in January), we have actually accumulated a loss of \$13,600 for the quarter.

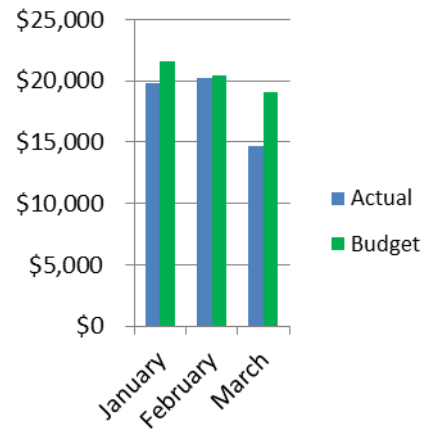
The general fund balance chart shows the effect on our cash flow. We started the year with about \$12,300 in the general fund. The loss of \$13,600 for the year puts the general fund in the red by \$1,300.

The budget we approved is dependent upon all of us keeping up on our pledges. We need all of us who fell behind our pledges in March to catch back up if we are to be able to pay our expenses.

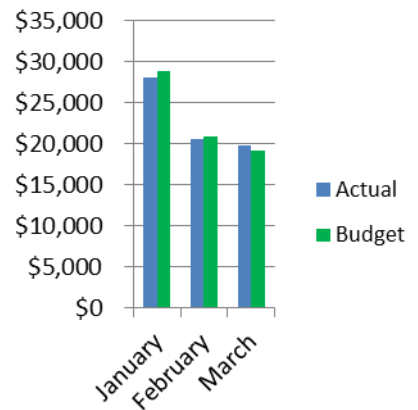

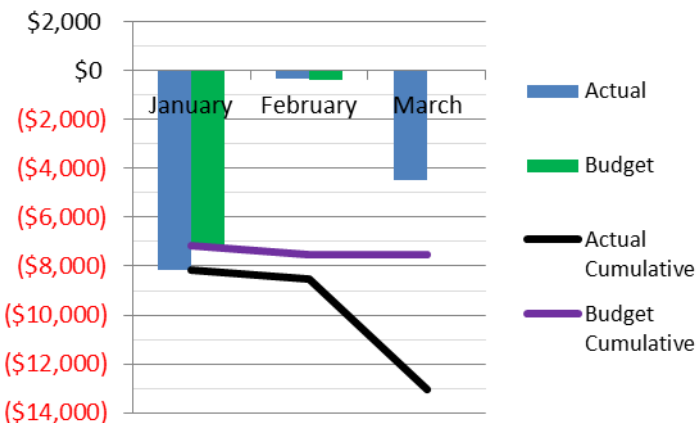
Income



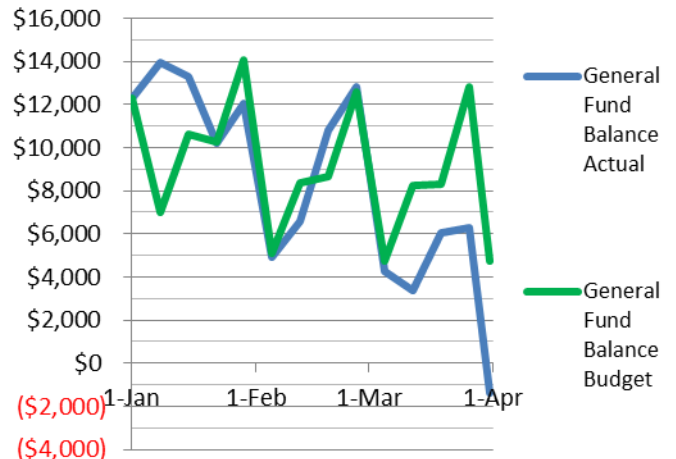
Expense

Our Stewardship



April traditionally is the time when we think of “new beginnings” and our focus is towards nature. And so it should be: The daffodils are blooming. Fruit trees are budding out. The lawn is beginning to grow (if the moss hasn’t overtaken it during the winter). People are itching to get out of doors and become active.

It is also a good time to think of our place in nature. Do we take what we have for granted without contributing something in return? Do we abuse it without thinking? Do we realize how all things in nature, including us---human being---all have an impact on everything around us? Are we aware of all of the raw materials that we use each day and where their origin. In short, are we good stewards of what God has given us?

There are many small things that each of us can do to collectively make a big difference in our environment. Many of these actions are good not only for the environment but also for us physically and economically. Recycling, of course comes to mind. Also reducing our use of electricity but turning off lights and other devices when they’re not in use. In the past few months, we have witnessed how devastating nature can be throughout the world, not only to the landscape but also to people: Earthquakes, tsunamis, flooding, wildfires, heavy snowloads that collapse buildings, and damaged power plants, all of which have killed and injured people.

Have we helped our fellow human being who have been impacted by nature’s actions by sharing what we are fortunate to have or just been spectators on TV or the web? Stewardship calls us to be active in times of need. For those people who have lost so much, a “new beginning” may be impossible without our help.

So, let each of us have a “new beginning” by being more conscious of our impacts on the environment and changing our habits by contributing something positive back to the planet. Let us more generous to those in need, not only at home but also throughout the world. Let us not forget that all that we have may be destroyed in the blink of an eye.

Let us take time to really see and enjoy what the Lord has provided us and be thankful for all that in found in nature.

Creator members have a wonderful opportunity to work with Habitat for Humanity this summer to help with the build of a new home for one of our member families! Silidio and Lucia Ntiranyibagira and their family have been selected to participate in the HFH program.

As a part of the program, Silidio, Lucia must complete 500 volunteer hours of 'sweat equity' work. Of those 500 hours, 200 hours may be completed by non-family members—that's us! Creator members may work with HFH to help on this build. Right now we are looking at several Saturdays this summer for Creator work-days.

Paul Kemp is coordinating this volunteer effort with Habitat for Humanity, as well as working with Silidio and Lucia as they work on the process, completing their part of the commitment to Habitat. We should have work dates from HFH soon and will be posting sign-ups for the work.

Volunteers must be 16 years old or older to work at the home site. Younger volunteers may work at the HFH office. You don't need to be skilled at carpentry—there are plenty of jobs to go around, and all tools and building materials are supplied by HFH. There is also a need for volunteers to provide lunches for work groups.

For April, Creator is collecting canned meals: Chili, stew, ravioli, hash, spaghetti and meatballs, tamales, etc. for the cupboard.

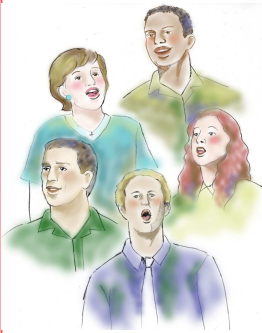

Project and provide a living wage as well as safe and environmentally responsible working and growing conditions. Brew some justice with your coffee.

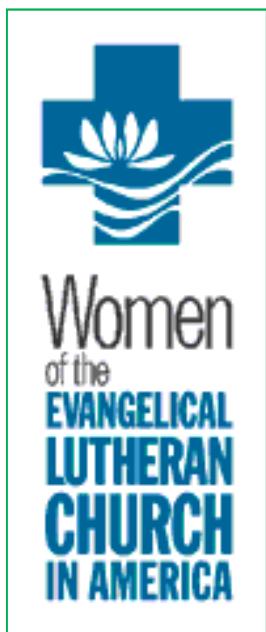


Congratulations to Kendal Shride

Backpack Buddies is Collecting Oral Care Items for Students

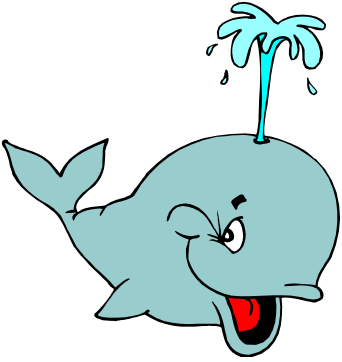


We will be collecting child sized toothbrushes and toothpaste for the Backpack Buddies recipients. Please bring these items and deposit them in the collection bin in the narthex.

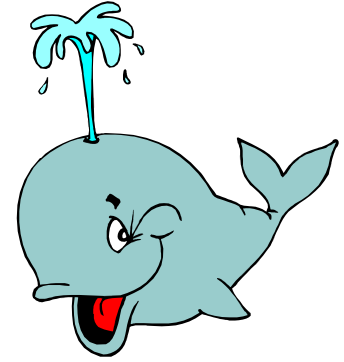
