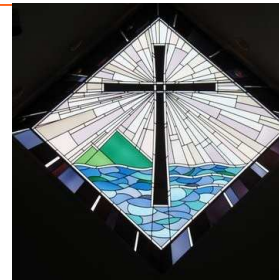

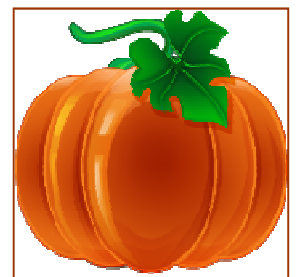

Jan	C	Children	Learn the name of a child in the congregation each week this month. Greet those children by name every time you come to church. Start developing a supportive relationship.
Feb	R	Receiving each other	Make it a point to introduce yourself to at least one or two people that you don't recognize in church each Sunday. How can you help new comers feel welcome at Creator?
March	E	Engaging Community	It's Mardi Gras! Find one way to help engage our community – how can we help the community know that Creator is here?
April	A	Advocacy	How do we help “make the rubber hit the road” with issues of social justice? What can we do – as individuals, families, and a congregation – help create room in our society for the disenfranchised?
May	T	Talent for hospitality	Determine your gifts and strengths for hospitality – what do <i>you</i> do well that provides welcome and acceptance for other people?
June	O	Outside the Church	How many times this month, can you let someone in your community know that you attend Creator? Can you mention a particular ministry of the church relevant to the community?
July	R	Re(member)ing	Re-acquaint yourself with people in the congregation who you don't know well. Consider who you have been missing at Creator and initiate contact. Is there something they need from us?
Aug	S	Signs	What are the visible signs of our welcome at Creator? Can you come up with another way to make our welcome more visible to the community around us and to the guests who walks in our doors?
Sept	G	Gift	What gift can we provide as a tangible sign of welcome to people who come in to our church as guests? What can you help create as a small token of hospitality?
Oct	I	Inviting	Invite someone you know to attend Creator this month and/or invite yourself to a community event as a representative of Creator.
Nov	F	Fellowship	Attend a non-worship church gathering this month – expand your fellowship connections. Who needs to be connected in fellowship and how can we facilitate those connections?

October Hospitality Emphasis: Invitation

As we look at what it means to invite, consider the possibility that invitation can be both toward ourselves as a congregation (as in inviting others to share in fellowship with us) and toward others in their activities (as in being present at the important events in the community as the face of Creator). Our October blurb says this: Invite someone you know to attend Creator this month and/or invite yourself to a community event as a representative of Creator. So our challenge this month is to expand our vision of what it means to be inviting!

Invitation directed toward Creator – This side of invitation is directed at inviting people to join us in our activities, usually in our space. Here is a challenge: Think of every activity that is happening at Creator or with Creator people for the rest of the year. Possibilities are:

- Church services on Sunday mornings
- Blessing of the pets
- Mid-week Advent services
- Christmas Eve service
- Labyrinth project

And many more! *Can you think of at least ONE Creator event that you can invite at least ONE person to before the end of the year?*

Invitation directed toward the community – Sometimes, people don't want to come into our space, not knowing who we are and whether we care. So besides inviting people **in**, we might want to think about inviting ourselves **out** into the community to become visible there. Here is the second challenge: Think of a community event or service project that you can participate in as the face/hands of Creator Lutheran Church – *can you invite yourself into service?* What opportunities are there to wear your Creator tee-shirt as you participate in a civic or charitable activity before the end of the year? Possibilities are: Working at King's Cupboard or the Food Bank

- Walking for Bethany's Boosters in Light in the Night
- Build with Habitat for Humanity
- Attend a school board meeting and speak up on an issue
- Work for Marriage Equality
- Attend an environmental justice event
- Volunteer in your local school

What other ways can you think of to be an *inviting* congregation?

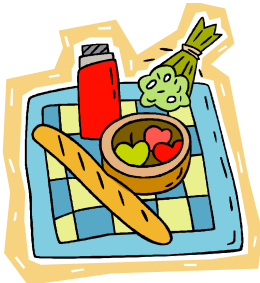

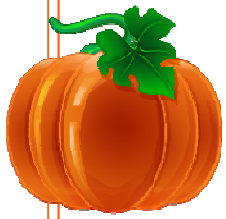
